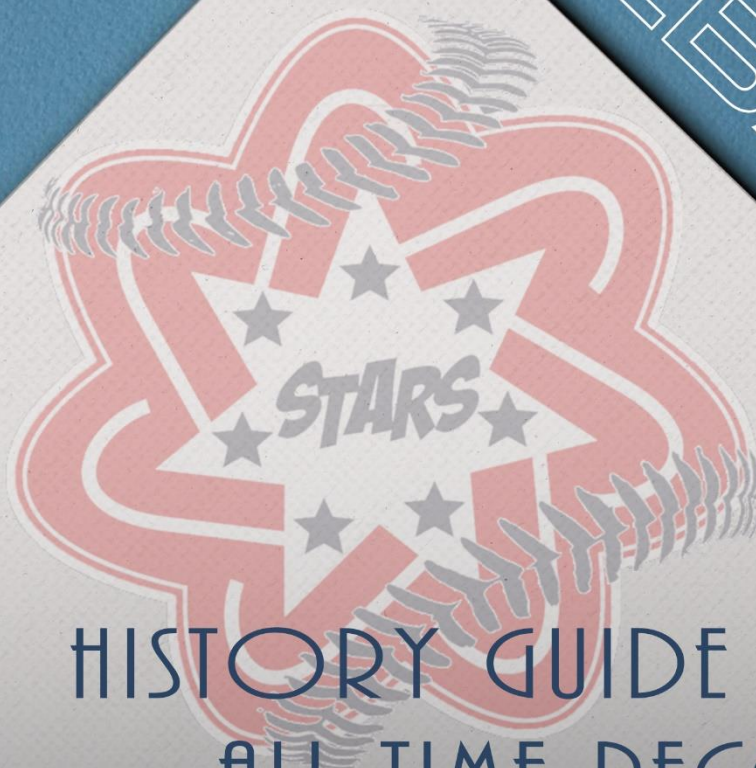

BNL Stars Baseball Make State Finals In 1st Year

Stars hoping to put it all together in finals

Mistakes cost several teams severely last weekend in the semi state round of the state high school baseball tourney. Without those mistakes there might have been a couple of different winners. Without them this weekend, Bedford-North Lawrence coach Orval Huffman hopes to be THE winner.

“At this stage of the game you have to put it all together,” said Huffman, whose 23-7 Stars are one of four teams vying for the state crown Saturday at Loeb Stadium in Lafayette. “You can't have any phase of the game lacking. Terre Haute North is as good if not better than any team in the state and look what happened to them when they made mistakes last week.”

The defending state champion North Patriots committed four errors last weekend that enabled Logansport to knock them out of play at Lafayette. Bishop Luers of Fort Wayne was eliminated when it made three errors in one inning that helped Hammond Noll get through the afternoon round of the South Bend semi-state. Noll took advantage of some base running blunders on the part of Elkhart Central later to win the title.

The Stars themselves scored twice on passed balls in their 3-1 championship victory over Greenwood at Jasper.

“You can't just do it at this level,” Huffman said regarding the errors of any kind. “You just can't make those kind of mistakes and survive. The teams are so good at this level that they take advantage of every error you make.”

The rest of the field, standing poised and ready to pounce on those errors should they occur, includes Logansport, 27-6, which will meet Bedford-NL at 11 AM; fourth-ranked Hammond Noll, 29-5, and fifth-ranked Indianapolis Marshall 31-4, the latter two meeting at 1:30 PM. The two winners will advance to the championship game to be played at 8:00 PM.

If errors do indeed tell the story Saturday, the recent performance of the Stars puts them in good standing. Averaging nearly three errors a game during the regular season, Bedford-NL has committed just six in seven tourney games.

“I think we've really begun to jell now at the end of the season and throughout the tournament,” Bedford-NL third baseman Dave Hickerson said. Hickerson, the team co-leader in errors during the regular season with 11, has committed just one in tournament play.

The Stars have been batting well lately, hitting .268 as a team, during the tourney. Although they may not set any records, it certainly surpasses their .236 regular season average and by far outshines a period in time when they got just nine hits and 106 at bats during a four-game losing string.

“Lately we've been hitting the ball, not just hits, but hitting the ball,” said Huffman, currently in his 20th year of coaching. “In the tourney I think we've been hitting the ball better than we did all year. And we've been hitting it hard.”

It has helped increase the star's rent production as they have outscored their tourney opponents, 57-9. Strong pitching has played an integral part in that too, as ace Mark Roberts and the No. 2 man Steve Martin have combined for an 0.60 tourney

ERA and they've allowed an average of just three hits per game. Roberts who owns a 13-2 record, bailed out Martin (6-3) Saturday in the semi-state championship by relieving twice and picking up the save with three innings of hitless ball.

Strong pitching is something the Stars will face in their state opener against Logansport. Junior lefty Jeff Jones, 9-1, is the likely starter for Jim Turner's Berries. Jones didn't have the best starts last week in the semi-state when he walked the bases full in the 2nd inning. Turner yanked him out and got strong relief pitching from Tom Packard for the victory, but Turner went back to Jones for the championship game.

"I had the confidence in Jones," he said. "This is a maturing year for him and he's hot and cold sometimes."

Jones, with a 2.48 ERA is backed by Ed Rennewanz (4-0, 1.39) and Brian Kinnaman (4-1) along with Packard.

The Berries, a good hitting team, sport five all-North Central conference players including conference MVP John Malloy, a .469 hitter at first base. Mike Atwell in centerfield and Jim Turner (the coach's son) at third are a couple of more strong hitters at a .390 and a .348 respectively.

"This squad has some real good talent," Turner said of his team. "We've got good hitters and we just keep swinging."

The other half of the field carries only one returnee to the final four in Indianapolis Marshall. The Patriots advanced to the championship game last year where they got ripped by Terre Haute North 12-1.

Marshall, an extremely experienced team, has plenty of quickness, witnessed by the fact that the Patriots pulled off 3 successful suicide squeeze plays. All three were set up by bunts off the bat of Pat Lowley.

The Patriots have good pitching, too, in John Katner 18-0 and Rich Lynch who threw a four-hitter as Marshall bumped off Connersville in the Richmond semi-state 9-1.



Marshall's opponent Saturday Hammond Noll, stands as the only other school among the four 1975 contenders who have been to the finals before, appearing in the 1968 when Warriors won the title. It's the first time ever for Bedford North Lawrence and Logansport.

If experience says anything Marshall won't have anything over Noll, as the Warriors have just won non-senior in their starting lineup. Jim Anderson's crew sports 3 pitchers with good records - Tom Philpott 9-1, 1.21; Tom Slabowski, 8-2 1.52, and Steve Mitchell 9-1 1.83. "None of our smoke throwers," Anderson admits but all three are control pitchers backed by a strong defense.

"We looked sloppy in the field Monday night though," he said. "We had five errors I'm afraid the jitters got to us and they may get to us this weekend. If we play a steady ball game we'll be alright."

BNL to honor 1977 team at Orval Huffman

BEDFORD — The year was 1977 and the world had lost some of its rattle and roll with the sudden death of Elvis Presley at age 42. But the first Apple Computer went on sale, Jimmy Carter had just been elected president of the United States, a gallon of gas -- soon to be so hard to find -- was 65 cents, and the Son of Sam was terrorizing the streets of New York City.

The baseball world was abuzz with the antics of Mark “The Bird” Fidrych, and Tom Seaver had been traded to the Cincinnati Reds, while here at home a bunch of baseball-loving boys captivated the community with a magical run to the IHSA State Baseball Finals.

The 1977 Bedford North Lawrence Stars, still riding a wave of momentum from the school's first-ever Final Four appearance in 1975, put together a great season that culminated with a 27-5 record (went 27-5 before falling at the semi-state level).

BNL will honor and recognize the team members and coaches Saturday prior to the start of the third annual Orval Huffman Classic Tourney, and will have a reception for the team to meet current players following the game.

The 1977 squad included Bret Johnson, Barry Webster, Vance Olson, Jim Sowders, Karl Brinegar, Nick Herthel, Jay Glasgow, Phil Inman, Tim Deckard, Brian Baugh, Brent Rains, Roger Lovell, Marty Speer, Larry Ridge, Steve Martin, Rob Ryan and Mike Faris, and a young Tim Waggoner earned some varsity spot duty. The managers were Eugene Brown, Tim Magnus and Pat Martin. Huffman, an Indiana Baseball Hall of Famer, was the head coach and his assistants were Ken Ransom, Mike Short and Dave Irwin.

Martin (third baseman and one of BNL's all-time best hitters) and Ridge (a menacing 6-foot-6-inch pitcher) were seniors and were later named to the Indiana All-Star team. Inman was also a feared pitcher and power-hitting first baseman, Baugh patrolled shortstop with aplomb, Herthel was a smooth second baseman, Faris was the catcher who had a huge postseason, and Brineger, Sowders and Speer provided speed and arm strength in the outfield. Barry Webster was the designated hitter and a strong utility infielder.

Lovell and Ryan provided power sticks in reserve, while Olson, Rains and Deckard supplied speed on the paths and loads of depth on the infield and catcher.

“I was just good enough to be on the team,” said an overly-modest Deckard, who was an outstanding all-around utility player. “I got to play some third base behind an Indiana All-Star in Steve Martin, but it was great to be on that team.

“One thing about that team is that baseball was the first love and, in a lot of cases, the only sport for many of the guys who were on that team, which I think is a lot like this year’s team. We loved to play the game, we loved playing together, and we had a great head coach and assistant coaches.

“We had a lot of speed, stole a lot of bases and put pressure on defenses with bunts and hit-and-run stuff, but also had power hitters and good pitching. It became a great season.”

The squad put together a 21-5 regular-season record, including a win over No.1-ranked Terre Haute North, and then really got its roll going in the tournament.

The Stars breezed through their own sectional, blanking Mitchell, 10-0, in the title tilt as Deckard delivered two triples and Martin bashed two doubles. Sowders and Ridge also slashed triples, with the latter no doubt producing much huffing and puffing from the big man. But Ridge was dominant on the mound, striking out 11 and allowing just one hit, a triple by Johnny Budd.

That sent BNL on to the Jasper Regional, and it swatted aside Loogootee, 9-4, in the semifinals as Brinegar blasted a home run, Martin was 2 for 2 with three RBIs, and Herthel and Baugh each went 2 for 3. That set up a duel with second-ranked Jasper on its home field for the championship, and the Stars were up to the task.

BNL blasted away for a 7-3 victory as Baugh went 3 for 3 with a double, Martin was 3 for 4 with a double, Faris added a double, while Herthel went 2 for 4, and Inman set the Ruxer Field crowd on its ear with a monumental shot.

“We had a lot of great hitters,” Deckard said. “Phil Inman hit a home run in the regional that I bet they’re still talking about. They had a new set of bleachers out in left-center and Phil hit it over those bleachers and out into the parking lot.”

That earned the Stars a return trip to Jasper for the regional the following weekend, and they needed some magic to make it out. BNL trailed South Spencer, 6-1, in the semifinal going to the sixth inning, but erupted for six runs on hits by Martin and Inman, a walk, and doubles by Sowders, Faris and Herthel to take the lead and ultimately win it. Martin and Sowders were each 3 for 4 and Webster, Faris and Inman added two hits.

The Stars faced 10th-ranked Clarksville in the championship game and were down 7-5 going to the bottom of the seventh inning. But hard-throwing Guy Finch got rattled, issuing three walks before plunking Sowders to force in the tying run. Faris then bounced a hit to left to drive in Baugh with the game winner. Martin hammered a home run, and Ridge had two RBIs and got the win in relief to run his record to 12-1.

That punched BNL’s ticket to Bush Stadium and the state finals, where No.11 Blackford County awaited in the semifinals. BC featured a great player in Bruce Robbins, who later that night signed a deal with the Detroit Tigers.

He had an RBI triple and RBI double against BNL, but did most of his damage with his arm, striking out 13 and allowing only three hits in a 3-2 triumph that ended the Stars’ dream of a state title. But BNL went down fighting.

The Stars scored in the bottom of the first on walks to Baugh and Martin ahead of an RBI single by Inman. But Blackford County built a 3-1 lead heading into the bottom of the seventh. Baugh led off with an infield single, and Rains came on to run for him. Martin smashed a double into the gap in right-center that bounced to the ivy bricks at Bush Stadium.

Rains was on the move, but with no outs third base coach Ransom opted to hold him there. Except Martin didn’t see the hold sign and was caught between second and third. Martin was tagged out in a rundown, though Rains scored to cut it to 3-2. Robbins settled down and got the final two outs to secure the win, though BC would fall to Logansport in the title tilt.

“We came up through the tournament on attitude, hustle and desire,” Huffman told then-Times-Mail Sports Editor Phil Bloom. “And we almost got into the final game with the same kind of play.”

Those are sage words, and they’re principles that will work for any generation. Thanks for the memories, boys of that 1977 summer.

BNL's hitters make the most of chances

Indianapolis - Tap, tap, tap, Rap, rap, rap.

Bedford North Lawrence, utilizing some robust raps and a trio of timely taps, moved within a single victory of its first baseball state championship by whipping Wes-Del 9-2 Saturday afternoon at blustery Bush Stadium.

Wes-Del's inability to stop BNL's bunting game was a key factor.

"At this level you have to advance runners and get your best shot at scoring some runs," BNL's first year coach John Bush said. "Usually don't get many chances."

"We started just trying to advance the runners. They had trouble handling it, so we milked it for all it's worth."

And it was worth a lot.

With BNL clinging to a 3-2 lead, Toby Meadows began the 4th inning by drawing a walk off Wes-Del southpaw John Kennedy. Chris Anderson followed with an RBI double to the gap in right center in advanced to 3rd on an ill-advised throw to the plate.

Nathan Underwood rolled a grounder to Keith Bennett at short and Bennett's throw to the plate was too late to get Anderson.

When Tad parks was summoned to replace Kennedy, Bush shifted strategy, abandoning the rap for a tap.

Brad Franklin bunted to the right of the mound and reached safely when Parks mishandled the ball. Corey Stevenson pushed his bunt to the other direction, and then again Parks failed to come up with a ball.

"We've been practicing the bunt since the sectional started," Stephenson noted. "We spent about 15 to 20 minutes every practice."

"We hadn't really used it until today. It paid off. They made some mistakes and we scored some runs."

Jason England rubbed salt and the Warriors wounds. He singled up the middle plated two runs, and then the Stars stretched the lead to 8-2 when freshman Coby Short bounced an RBI single to right.

The bunting game also played an integral role in BNL's two run first inning after Rickie Flynn battled back from an 0-2 count to draw a leadoff walk, Meadows tapped the ball toward the right side. Kennedy gathered in the ball and rifled it in past Parks at first.

Flynn raced home, and Meadows motored to third period Underwood followed with a 390 foot sacrifice fly to right center. The Indians took advantage of two BNL errors to draw even in the third.

“A lot of the errors had to do with jitters,” England said. “If we make 5 errors in the next game we’ll get beat.” “Chris (Anderson) did an excellent job considering that happened. We didn’t give him much help. He had to do it himself.”

England put the stars on top for good with an RBI single to left with one out in the fourth. “The first time up I bear I was swinging at everything and I struck out,” he said. “Then coach Jerry Chaney gave me some simple advice. He said see the ball and hit the ball. That’s what I did, and it worked.” England drove in three runs accounted for two of BNL’s seven hits.

The Warriors put their first two batters on base in the fourth and looked as though they may take the lead when Ryan Harlan hammered a drive toward left. “I thought I was dead,” said Short, who replaced Trent Todd in the left in the fourth. “Because of the background I couldn’t tell how hard it was hit, and you couldn’t hear it coming off the bat. I started in to my left, and then I saw it. I just sprinted back and the wind held it up for me.”

Anderson then fanned both Jeremy Rodecap and Bennett to defuse the threat. “Chris was throwing harder than it normally does,” Stephenson said. “He had a good curveball and he was throwing heat.”

The Star stranded a pair of runners in both the 3rd and the 4th innings. “I was a little worried about squandering many chances,” Bush admitted “but the kids just kept it at it. They’ve done it all year.”



Orval Huffman Hall of Fame

Orval Huffman inducted into state's Hall of Fame

Jasper - After 26 years of coaching high school baseball, Bedford's Orval Huffman was inducted to the Indiana baseball Hall of Fame Friday evening.

Huffman, who spent the final 14 seasons at the helm of the Bedford Stonecutters and Bedford North Lawrence Stars joined Al Pilarcik, Paul Wolf and Edward "Red" Carrington as the 1987 inductees during a ceremony proceeding the 13th annual North-South All Star series.

"I'm joining an elite group, said Huffman, who compiled a sensational 420-155 record as a head coach, and twice took the Stars to the Final Four. "I hope I've done something to help the game of baseball."

"There have been 3 highlights in my career: going to the state finals, coaching the All-Stars (in 1977), and now entering the Hall of Fame. It's quite a thrill and honor."

Huffman was presented a large plaque by former Jasper coach Ray Howard, who said he had fond memories of Orval Huffman. "We were competitors from the third base box coaching box many times."

In addition to Huffman, Pilarcik was honored as a former player.

A Whiting native, Pilarcik played in the major leagues for the Baltimore Orioles, Kansas City Athletics, and Chicago White Sox for more than five seasons, ending with a career batting average of .256. He is presently a teacher at Lake Central High school.

Wolf, honored as a coach, was head baseball coach at Indiana State, where he was a four-time coach of the year. He also played baseball and basketball at ISU and served in the athletic department for 42 years.

Carrington, from Fort Wayne, was inducted for his work as a contributor to the game.

The president of the Fort Wayne Baseball Federation, which oversees amateur and youth baseball, Carrington Field was named in his honor in 1978.

The guest speaker for the evening was former New York Yankee and Hall of Fame pitcher Vernon "Lefty" Gomez, who entertained the audience with his stories of antics in the major and minor leagues.

"I certainly had a lot of fun pitching and managing later in his career, said Gomez, who won 189 games 14 seasons. "I can remember the first game I nearly got into. I was in the bullpen and our left-handed pitcher was in trouble."

"I was praying that I wouldn't get in, but when the next batter lined one off the pitcher, manager Bob Shawkey signaled for me."

"As I walked in to the mound at Yankee Stadium, the pitcher got back up and started walking around, and I was applauding as loud as anyone."

When I got there, I looked at Shawkey and said, “I know the bases are loaded and there's one out, so you want me to get a double play, right?”

“Shawkey just looked at me and snarled, ‘No, he broke the webbing in his glove, and he need yours, so get back out to the bullpen.’”

“That was the first game I almost got into.”

Gomez also recalled playing with Yankee greats Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, Tony Lazzeri, and Joe DiMaggio.

“I just made my best pitch, ran like mad, and backed up third,” he said with a sly grin. “I made a star out of DiMaggio (his roommate for six seasons). Nobody knew he could go back on a ball until he played behind me.”

After his playing days, Gomez embarked on a managerial career. Starting in winter baseball and in the minor leagues.

“In the minors we wrapped up last place on Opening Day. If we got rained out, we had a victory dinner.”

“One young kid asked me the best way to play a line drive back at him, and I told him to charge it before it picked up speed.”

On a more serious note, Gomez congratulated the All-Stars.

“You'll never forget this game,” said Gomez, who still holds a World Series record for winning percentage 6-0.

The All-Star series gets underway and today with a double header at Jasper's Recreation Field at 5:00 PM, followed by a single game on Sunday at 1:00 PM. The North leads the series 23-11.

Bedford North Lawrence's Jeff Callahan will perform for the South squad.

HISTORIC TRIUMPH! Stars conquer Red Devils 3-2 to win first HHC championship in program history

JEFFERSONVILLE – With history hanging on his dead-tired left arm, with nothing but adrenaline and ice water coursing through his weary body, Cutler Chastain was determined to finish what he started. Even when his worried coach approached the mound, asking the toughest question a pitcher doesn't want to hear or honestly answer, there was no way he was surrendering the baseball.

Win or lose, with a memory-making victory or heartbreaking loss at stake, Chastain was the horse Bedford North Lawrence rode in on. And the Stars were rewarded for their faith in the junior hurler with a triumph for the ages.

After weaving through more traffic than a Kentucky Derby winner, Chastain was the stallion that powered BNL to a gutsy win and program history. As Chastain completed a heroic performance with his 16th strikeout, the Stars exploded in euphoria with a tense 3-2 win over Jeffersonville in the Hoosier Hills Conference championship on Friday night.



The league dates back to 1973, and the baseball title is the one with the most parody. Jeffersonville owns the most conference crowns with 11, and the Red Devils were the defending champion. BNL, for all its glory and tradition, for all the outstanding players and teams that have graced the diamond, had never won the coveted jewel.

Until now. The Stars exorcised a curse, the demons, whatever had been keeping them from joining the list of champions. That's over. That's why they erupted with unabashed glee, with the emotions spewing out like a volcanic eruption. This was for 50-plus years of frustration, for all those who have worn the uniform.

"What an accomplishment," BNL coach Steven McNabb said. "They can't take it away from them now. They were the first ones."

Heroes were everywhere as BNL won at Jeffersonville, officially known as Don Poole Field but a den of devils for the Stars during their history, for the first time since 2016. Chastain allowed only four hits while hurling 123 pitches. Grady Dalton was a key figure during the two-run sixth that gave the Stars the lead, and he threw out a runner at the plate in the seventh to cut down the tying run. Reece Goodgame came through with a clutch two-out RBI in the seventh for what proved to be the winning run.

"It's awesome," Dalton said. "We showed a lot of perseverance. There's been a lot of ups and downs, injuries, and this shows a lot about us. It shows the kind of teams we are."

For the first five innings, pitchers ruled. Jeff starter Evan Shelton was working some devilish magic, throwing a no-hitter until Gates ripped a two-out double down the left-field line in the sixth. Dalton followed with a soft ground ball to third base, but he reached when the throw to first was dropped. Gates never slowed to score the first run, and Chastain crushed a triple to deep right-center for a 2-0 lead.



The Red Devils (13-9) did not die easily. They scored a run in the sixth on a BNL error, but with runners on second and third, Gates fanned Grant Smith looking to escape.

In the seventh, Chase Rynders singled and Riley Sons reached on an error. With two outs, Goodgame stroked a solid single to center for what would be a crucial insurance run.

The Devils threatened immediately in the seventh when Chastain allowed a single to the first batter and hit the next. When Carter Durbin dropped a sacrifice bunt, Chastain's throw to first went to an uncovered bag as the ball bounced into right field. With the first runner already home, Dalton hustled in from right to back up the play at first and fired a high strike to the plate. Gates skied to snag the rocket throw and fell to the turf to tag out Jeff's Braylon Gray.

"He was waiting for that play," Chastain said. "That was amazing."

"That was unbelievable," Gates added. "All I had to do was jump up and tag him." With Durbin perched on third, still representing the tying run, Chastain struck out the next two batters, both looking, to set off the wild celebration.

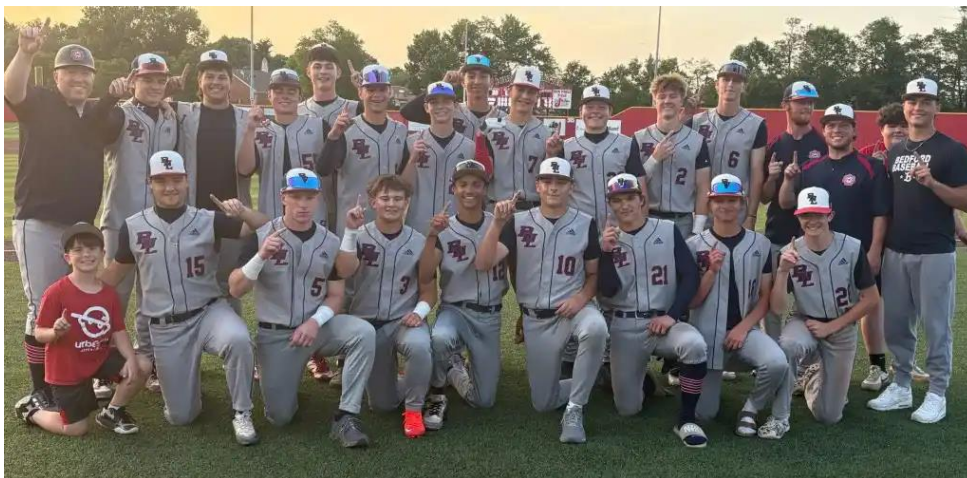
Wow. What a finish, what a win. Jeffersonville came in as the hottest team in the league with an eight-game winning streak. BNL left with the crown. "It was not easy at all," Dalton said. "There's a lot of nerves in these kind of games." "It's awesome," Chastain said. "This group has been working for something like this, dreaming about this since we were little kids."

Chastain, the Indiana State recruit, was the workhorse. After throwing six innings in the HHC opening win over New Albany on Monday, he came back with a gritty complete game, with no fuel left at the end. Only fumes and heart. "I can't say enough good things about Cutler," McNabb said. "I knew Jeff would not go away quietly, and we made a couple of bad mistakes. When you have a guy like Cutler, and guy like Cam behind the plate, you give yourself a chance. "We overthrew him a little bit, but the HHC championship for the first time in school history was worth it. He wanted it, he wouldn't let me take him out, and the guys wouldn't let me take him out. They were all in on him."

"If it wasn't for adrenaline, that would have been tough to get through," Chastain said. "But in that spot, as the ace, I have to get through it and get it done for my guys."

Almost lost in all the celebration was the Goodgame impact. "What a senior he's been, what a senior leader he is for our school, for our team," McNabb said. "A great young man, it couldn't have happened to a better kid. You have to get those things done, two-out hitting and timely runs. That got us to a HHC championship."

The Stars improved to 11-8 with their fourth straight win. That last three mattered the most. "It means everything, it's huge," Gates said. "We started off the season rough, but man, have we brought it back."
